Alpha Fodrin

Description Fodrin (also named nonerythroid spectrin)

is a universally expressed

membrane-associated cytoskeletal protein consisting of alpha- and beta-subunits (1). This protein is important for maintaining

normal membrane structure and

supporting cell surface protein function (1). Alpha-fodrin is one of the primary targets cleaved by caspases during

apoptosis.

Storage Condition and Buffer Rabbit IgG in phosphate buffered saline ,

pH 7.4, 150mM NaCl, 0.02% sodium azide and 50% glycerol. Store at +4°C short term. Store at -20°C long term. Avoid

freeze / thaw cycle.

Function

Fodrin, which seems to be involved in secretion, interacts with calmodulin in a calcium-dependent



manner and is thus candidate for the calcium-dependent movement of the cytoskeleton at the membrane.

Cellular Location


Cytoplasm, cytoskeleton. Cytoplasm, cell cortex. Note=Expressed along the cell membrane in podocytes and presumptive tubule cells during glomerulogenesis and is expressed along lateral cell margins in tubule cells.
